## **BOATING RULES OF CONTACT**

- 1. Users of the Canal do so at their own risk.
- 2. Canal passenger boats and work boats have right of way at all times.
- 3. No private powered or sailing boats are allowed. There are no private mooring rights.
- 4. All canoe and paddleboard group sessions are to be supervised by an authorised instructor (parents or guardians in the case of family groups).
- 5. No damage is to be caused to the Canal banks or vegetation. Wildlife must not be disturbed.
- 6. Courtesy and consideration are to be shown to anglers and all other Canal users.
- 7. Access to and from the Canal is from the towpath side only.
- 8. Annual licences for canoes and paddleboards must be affixed to the craft in a visible position.
